

Following Up After Supportive Housing Week Visits

A site visit is often just the beginning of a relationship with a congressional office. Following up after a visit helps reinforce key messages, thank elected officials and staff for their time, and keep supportive housing top of mind as policy and funding decisions are made. Members of Congress and their staff value opportunities to hear directly from constituents, service providers, and residents about the impact of federal programs in their communities. A thoughtful thank you message can strengthen that connection, highlight important takeaways from the visit, and position your organization as a trusted resource on supportive housing and disability issues throughout the year.
